How is an **adjective** like a **magnet**?



Magnets are attracted to magnetic material.
Adjectives are attracted to nouns (and pronouns).

Any time you find an adjective, you will also find a noun (or pronoun) nearby that the adjective is modifying.



Adjective Noun or Pronoun

- Reed has a huge dog.
- My sister is shy.
- Math is my favorite subject.
- Paul's basketball coach is tall.
- I counted twenty little fish in the aquarium.

shy sister
favorite subject
basketball coach

Expanded noun phrases


Task 1



Animal Town


