Hip (Hide IP pro) is an app designed to allow the user to hide documents, photos and videos. The app, on its




BEING KIND ONLINE

If your child is online, then it's important that we talk to our child about being kind online. For example, only posting positive comments, don't say anything they wouldn't say in real life and treat others as they would expect to be treated.

Your child also needs to be aware that what they see online isn't always the full picture. People only share what they want you to see and images are often filtered. It is also important that your child knows how to block and report any inappropriate behaviour when they see it.
