# Curriculum Corner

#### PSHE – Core value for autumn term:

Equality: At Chadwell St Mary we all respect each other and are treated equally. Equality refers to the right of every individual to equal treatment and opportunities, regardless of factors like gender, race and social position.



This term in PSHE the children have been looking at the topic 'Being Me'. In year 1 they have been talking about their family, friends and school life. Across the school, the children have been having discussions on our first puzzle piece 'equality'. It is important that the children know what our school core values are. We will be looking at a different core value each term. **Phonics** - The children have all settled into their new phonic groups. They are showing good learning behaviours and are really engaged in their sessions. I was particularly impressed with Yellow reading group this week, who were using the letter's name to spell words correctly. Well done!

Music – As you may have guessed, music is a key part of CSM. From the morning playlists (which the children have chosen), through to assembly songs, to a lunchtime boogie- we love a song!

If you have any requests, please let DJ Moorcraft know, and we'll add to our rather extensive list. Music has the ability to alter emotions and calm the soul. The song we are currently listening to in assembly is "On My Way" from the film Brother Bear. Perfect for the start of a new academic year.

Reading - Children across the school have quickly started building on the reading skills they learned and practised last year and are enjoying discussing a wide range of stories. Blue Peter have launched an exciting new 'Blue Peter Book Badge' which can be earned by children who share their book reviews in the Blue Peter Book Club. Talk 4 writing - Pupils are learning how to write a narrative text and it's great to see all the text maps displayed in the classrooms. Last week, pupils took part in a number of drama activities to help with their understanding of the characters they will be describing in their writing. Pupils also focused on using a wide range of vocabulary and created extensive word banks ready to use in their writing this week. We look forward to reading their finished pieces of writing.

**RE** – In RE this week year 6 have been learning about Hinduism. We have talked about the importance of Krishna and how he is represented in stories when he was a young child compared to how he is represented in stories as an adult. We learnt Krishna represents the importance of showing love to God. We also learnt the Bhagavad Gita is Hindus' holy book that teaches them the qualities you need to be a good human.

Geography - Year 1 have been learning about the four countries that make up the United Kingdom. They have started to look at these places in detail and learn about some of the capital cities.

Maths - We are very excited to be back in our maths routines around the school. The school has been full of fast arithmetic skills in our 'Fluent For Five' questions and I have loved hearing the Times Table Rockstars music playing as I have walked down the corridor this week. The children are very engaged in

improving their multiplication speed. Here is a reminder of the year groups and their times tables to learn.

Year 2 – 2, 5 and 10

Year 3 – 3, 4 and 8

Year 4 to 6 - all times tables 2 - 12

Computing - Last week, all classes from year one to year 6 had a computing lesson focused on internet safety. Each class spoke about how we can be safe online and who we can talk to if we are concerned. Miss Terry was particularly impressed with year 1. The children were able to share their ideas and give top tips on how we can be safe online. Keep up the hard work year 1!

Art & D & T - Already this term, pupils have produced some fabulous artwork. Year 2 have studied Yayoi Kusama, and her dotty artwork! We've had some wonderful sketching further up the school, super stilllife in year 3 and colour and tone exploration in Year 6.
