This half term

'Do you want to be friends?' is our first topic in reception. This topic gives the children an opportunity to explore friendships, learn the rules and routines in class, learn about the people who help us in school and people who help us outside of school. We have a Teddy Bears' Picnic role play area and home corner set up in the outdoor area. The children will learn through lots of exploration.

Reading records

This week the children have been given a book with simple words in to bring home. Try asking your child to spot the sounds we have learnt in class. We have been learning m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g and o. You could also sound out the word for your child and ask them to blend it.

The reads recorded in the record book will be counted every week and the children are awarded in Tuesday afternoon's assembly for every 25 reads. You should be reading with your child for 10 minutes, 5 times a week.
