You can book a full day, a half day, a few days, some half days or a whole week or two if you prefer. All children will need plenty of drinks and anyone booked on to a full day will need a pack lunch.

We expect good behaviour from all children whilst attending so that the days are not spoilt by anyone and everyone has fun. Repeated poor behaviour will result in the place being withdrawn.

You need to book as detailed below to secure your place(s).

Numbers are limited to ensure the safety and enjoyment of the children attending.

#### **Bookings and payment**

Bookings and Payment will need to be made through your child's school's Gateway account no later than Sunday 15th October. Please go to the School Gateway App where you be able to book and pay for the sessions you require.

Please contact the school office if you need help with booking/paying and they will provide support.

# **Mobile Phones in School**

Please can you ensure that your child does NOT bring a mobile phone into school UNLESS THEY WALK HOME UNACCOMPANIED.

Children are not allowed to have phones in school and any brought in must be handed in. When phones are brought in unnecessarily, it creates a distraction when they need to be collected in and returned and there is a chance that they become muddled up/and or lost. Please help us to focus on teaching and learning and only allow your child to bring in a phone if it is truly needed for the safety of walking home alone. Pupils must not use phones whilst on school premises at all. Pupils will be reminded during assembly today that phones must be switched off first thing in the morning, once they arrive safely at school, and should remain switched off until they have the left school grounds at the end of the day.

## **Jewellery in School**

Please may we remind you that due to health and safety reasons, jewellery should not be worn routinely to school. It is becoming an issue which is neither safe nor sensible and it is taking up valuable learning time to manage. As per our Uniform Policy on the school's website:

The school rules on jewellery are as follows:

- One pair of stud earrings may be worn no other piercings are permitted.
- No loose fitting jewellery such as necklaces or bracelets

Pupils will be advised that jewellery is their personal responsibility and not that of the school. Lost or damaged items will not be refunded. All jewellery must be removed on days when children have PE. The wearing of jewellery is creating a significant issue especially on PE days when too many children are unable to remove earrings and/or do not bring tape to cover the studs.

Going forward, please can you help us to focus on the important task of teaching and ensure that if studs have to be worn on PE days, children can remove them or that you provide tape?

If children come into school wearing earrings other than studs, they will need to be removed and kept safely in the school's safe. If the child cannot remove them, then a parent/carer will need to attend the school to do so. Bracelets and necklaces will need to be removed and will be kept in the school's safe until collect by a parent/carer.

Please note that we respect all faiths and permission to wear jewellery on religious grounds will need to be sought from the Head of School in writing and evidence provided before it can be authorised.



<u>PSHE</u> – In PSHE all year groups are continuing to look at the topic 'Being Me'. In years 2 and 3, the children are identifying positive things about themselves and are talking about their achievements. During their PSHE lessons they are setting personal goals and discussing how they can achieve these goals and ask for help if needed.

<u>Phonics</u> - Reception have been learning lots of sounds. They are beginning to blend and segment the sounds in words independently!

<u>Music</u> – We use the Charanga scheme to deliver our music curriculum. It introduces pupils to a wide range of musical genres and a wide range of subject specific vocabulary.

Reading — When we can read fluently, we can understand or comprehend what we are reading. If your child is finding it tricky to read their book fluently, help them practise reading a paragraph or part of the story a few times. You could see how many words they read in a minute the first time they read it and see how much they improve on the second, third or even fourth try! The feeling of being able to read fluently really boosts their confidence as a reader.

<u>Talk 4 writing - This week Year 5 have been writing</u> formal letters based round their class text 'Holes'. We have been incredibly impressed with the vocabulary they are using in their writing and their understanding of language to ensure they sound formal- well done, year 5- keep up the hard work!

<u>RE</u> – This term in RE, Year 4 are learning about Sikhism. They have been studying special religious Sikh ceremonies and their main beliefs. Year 4 have focused on the Sikh baptismal ceremony of Amrit. During this lesson, pupils were able to explain what the five Ks symbolise.

<u>Maths</u> - The children are working on problem solving investigations linked to place value across the school this term. Mrs Dennis has been impressed with their resilience in these tasks, especially in year 1 and 2. We would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate our Times Table Ambassadors. They will form an important role in helping the children across the school to learn and recite their times tables. Watch this space!

**Geography** - In Geography, Year 5 have been learning about the UK. They have learnt about the landscape of the UK and areas of natural beauty including, famous landmarks.

<u>Computing</u> — Year 2 have been very busy in computing making their own soundtracks using a software called 2Sequence. The children have experimented with different tempos when playing nursery rhymes. The children are becoming more independent when using Purple Mash and are more aware of how to save their work. Keep up the hard work year 2!

<u>Science</u> - there are lots of exciting things happening in Science this week. Year 5 have been learning about Space! What space facts do you know? Did you know that the moon takes 28 days or roughly 1 month to orbit the earth.
