led the celebration assembly on Tuesday and the pupils sang one of our Christmas songs "All around the world" beautifully - it was pure joy! <u>Reading</u> - We have been looking at our exciting 'reading tree' in the hall and can see plenty of leaves starting to appear on it. These have been awarded to children who have read at home 25 or 50 times so far. Very well done to all of those children and thank you for supporting them with their learning. It's not too late to earn the rewards as we keep counting how many times your child has read at home throughout the year. Who will be among the first to earn a shiny green leaf for 75 reads?

Talk 4 writing - After reading 'The Tiger Who Came To Tea', Year 1 have been learning how to write fantasy stories. The children have been focusing on their use of language and Mrs Chakli and Miss Terry have been very impressed with the use of adjectives to describe the characters and the setting in the pupils' work- well done, Year 1; we cannot wait to read the whole story.

<u>RE</u> – Happy Diwali! Last weekend, Hindus around the world celebrated the festival of lights. Diwali symbolises good over evil and knowledge over ignorance. Year 3 are learning all about Diwali and why this special celebration is important to Hindus.

<u>History -</u> It was great to see the whole school celebrating Remembrance Day and making poppies. The children in Reception were able to talk about the soldiers and how brave they were when fighting for our country.

<u>Maths -</u> Most year groups have been relating addition and subtraction to money problems in their maths lessons. It is important to relate mathematical concepts to real life situations such a shopping. Please encourage your child to help you count and select the coins/notes when purchasing items at the shops. Alternatively, ask them to help you add the total cost of some items.
