If you are a working parent and looking for childcare, the 30 hours funded childcare is expanding! Working parents of all children over the age of nine months will also be entitled to funded 30 hours of childcare.

For all primary aged children from reception to year six, from September 2024, you can expect to see an increase in the number of wraparound childcare places available across Thurrock. Wraparound care is before and after school (8am-6pm) childcare for primary school aged children in England during term time. With your help by completing the survey, we expect all parents who need it to have access to wraparound care. Either from their school or from another provider in your local area, by September 2026. By accessing funded childcare for 9 months to 4 years and the funded Tax Free Childcare you will be able to get help with childcare costs.

# Curriculum Corner

PSHE – This term in PSHE all year groups will be looking at their dreams and goals. The PSHE lessons will be discussion based and children will have the opportunity to write about their goals in life.
Our school core value this term is 'Perseverance'. All pupils will learn what it means to persevere and there be an assembly focusing on this value.
Phonics – The children are back into routine and adjusting well to their new groups. Thank you to all the parents/carers who showed their children the phonics videos over the half term. They really do support the learning thats happening in class.
Music – We need a new 2024 playlist!

(with appropriate lyrics) please ask you child(ren) to

let me know, or catch me on the gate on Wednesday mornings!

<u>**Reading**</u> - This week children are starting their new Talk 4 Reading books and have shared their initial thoughts on the books. They have been able to express their opinions about the stories so far and give reasons for their opinions and even quoted parts of the story to support what they say. When discussing anything, it helps develop vocabulary when children are encouraged to give examples and reasons to support what they say. Try doing this at home when talking to your child about their reading book.

**<u>RE</u>** Last half term, Year 6 were learning about the importance of churches in the community. This week Year 6 had a wonderful trip to Chadwell St Mary Church where the children had a workshop with Rev'd Kate about how the church supports the local community and internationally.

This half term Year 6 will be learning about the importance of the Qu'ran in the Islamic faith. <u>Geography -</u> This half term Year 1 will be learning about the continents. They will begin this topic by focussing on Europe and the country France. They will look at where France is on the map, what the country is famous for and some significant landmarks.

Talk 4 writing - For the first two weeks the whole school is focusing on narrative writing. In Reception, they are reading the story called 'Handa's Surprise' where the children will look at the pictures in the story and write at least one sentence about what in happening in the picture remembering to use a capital letter and a full stop.

<u>Maths -</u> This week, all year groups have learnt about the importance of place value. Place value is a fundamental concept in mathematics that refers to the value of each digit in a number based on its position. It was great to see year 5 confidently ordering 6-digit numbers and applying their knowledge to problem solving tasks too!

<u>Computing –</u> This week in computing each class have focused on Internet Safety. They have discussed ways they can stay safe and who they can speak to if they feel worried.

<u>Science –</u> Famous scientist facts! Sir Alexander Fleming was a Scottish microbiologist and physician who is best known for developing penicillin, the world's first broadly effective antibiotic.
